

DORKING

SUNDAY 4 AUGUST

Prudential RideLondon is the world's greatest festival of cycling with more than 100,000 cyclists participating in seven events on traffic-free roads in London and Surrey. Events will take place in central London on Saturday 3 August and in London and Surrey on Sunday 4 August 2019.

Prudential RideLondon was developed by the Mayor of London, Transport for London and London & Partners in partnership with Surrey County Council and is sponsored by Prudential. The event is managed by the London & Surrey Cycling Partnership.

Detailed below is important local information to help Dorking residents and businesses plan their day.

EVENTS IN SURREY

Sunday 4 August

- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100, a mass participation ride for 25,000 cyclists; passing locally from 08:10 until 14:05.
- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic, a race for 150 professional cyclists; passing through Dorking High Street once between 15:15 and 15:20.

All event timings are predicted and may vary slightly.

ROAD CLOSURES

Roads closed from 05:00:

A25 from Newlands Corner to Dorking High Street at Moore's Road.

Roads closed from 07:30:

London Road from High Street to A24 (Deepdene Avenue) A24 northbound (London Road) from Deepdene Roundabout to Burford Bridge.

A24 southbound from Mickleham to Pixham Roundabout (also includes the roads listed above at 05:00).

Anticipated road reopening times

Roads will begin to reopen from 16:30 as soon as it is safe and practical to do so once the professional race has passed for a final time.

Dorking High Street will remain closed between South Street (Pump Corner) and Moore's Road for a longer period whilst barriers are removed.

All barriers are being installed on the morning of the event and removed during the evening. No roads are closed on Saturday 3 August.

LOCAL ACCESS

Vehicle crossing points

Vehicles can cross the event route from Station Road, along West Street and onto South Street (southbound only) as well as Vincent Lane, onto Station Road (northbound only) until 07:30.

Limited access in and around Dorking is available throughout the day via Ashcombe Road but recommended prior to 10:00 and after 13:00.

At Ashcombe Road there will be a marshalled vehicle crossing point of the event route at the traffic lights to the A24 southbound, giving access to the station, Dorking car parks and to both the A25 eastbound and A24 southbound towards Horsham. The return across the event route is accessed via Pixham Lane, A24 southbound and then right onto Ashcombe Road.

Safe crossing of the route by vehicles at Ashcombe Road will operate slowly; allow extra time for any journey. It is recommended for use only when essential and delays are to be expected during the peak period of cyclists passing through Dorking between 10:00 and 13:00.

The A24 southbound (inc. Deepdene Avenue) between Pixham Lane and Deepdene Roundabout remains open all day.

Please follow the instructions of the traffic marshals for everyone's safety.

Dorking (Main) and Deepdene railway stations

Vehicle access to the main station car park for drop off and parking is available throughout the day. To reach the station by car, access must be from A25 Reigate Road, using Pixham Lane to the A24, then travelling southbound towards the station as usual. Exit from the station must be made southbound on the A24 towards Deepdene (Cockerel) Roundabout.

The access arrangements above, and similar ones in other areas, are intended for the convenience of local residents only and are not advertised widely.

Please be aware of the wider road closures across the event route in Surrey.

Pedestrian crossing points

Existing crossing points will have marshals present to direct you to the closest pedestrian crossing point and assist pedestrians to cross the event route.

PARKING

Vehicles cannot park on the event route from 00:01 on Sunday 4 August. Any vehicle left on the route or parked in a suspended parking bay will be removed from the route. Roads adjoining the event routes will have local access only for residents and businesses, with usual Sunday parking restrictions applied unless otherwise stated.

CAR PARKS

Displaced parking is available from Saturday 3 August at Reigate Road car parks for access to A24 southbound and A25 eastbound. Car parking is available throughout the day at Pippbrook and Dorking Halls accessible from Deepdene (Cockerel) Roundabout, in addition to the car park at Dorking train station (see Local Access above).

South Side car park can be accessed from Chart Lane, Marlborough Hill and Marlborough Road throughout the day.

Mole Valley District Council car parks are free from 18:00 on Saturday and free on Sunday. Charges apply from 08:00 on Monday.

Both petrol stations within Dorking are accessible throughout the day.

LOCAL BUSINESSES / WHAT'S ON

Shops in Dorking High Street will be open. Many locations will be hosting community events and there are many great locations to watch the events.

Dorking High Street is one of the best locations on the route to get close to the action with the 25,000 amateur riders passing through followed soon afterwards by the professional race which passes through once on its way to Box Hill.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Emergencies will be treated as a priority in the usual way. If you require the emergency services, call 999. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained and prioritised throughout all of the Prudential RideLondon events. Planning for Prudential RideLondon involves the police, fire and rescue services, ambulance services, local hospitals and other critical welfare services.

ASSISTANCE

ON THE DAY

Stewards and volunteers will be positioned along the route. If you require assistance on the day that is not a 999 emergency, please ask the event staff who will be able to help or escalate issues if necessary. Alternatively, contact our Customer Services team on 0345 894 9773.

COMMUNITY WELFARE

Prudential RideLondon works with a wide variety of care providers across the entire route in order to plan for the impact of closed roads on Sunday 4 August. If you are unsure about care provision on the day or have private arrangements, please contact our Customer Services team so we can help you plan appropriately.

SAFETY

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. These will be supervised to help pedestrians cross the road throughout the event. Please note that some existing pedestrian crossings may be suspended, but an alternative, where it is easier to cross, will be clearly signed.

We thank you for your patience during the event. Please listen to instructions given by our stewards and volunteers.

Although roads will be closed to general traffic, there will be bicycles and event vehicles using the road during the closure period. Please do take additional care, looking in both directions when crossing the road or accessing and exiting your property, particularly if there is no footway. In certain locations, stewards will be available to assist you.

LONDON MARATHON CHARITABLE TRUST

Prudential RideLondon is part of the London Marathon event family. Organisations in the areas in which London Marathon Events Limited holds events are eligible to apply for grants from The London Marathon Charitable Trust to support facilities that enable increased participation in physical activities.
