

FOREST GREEN

SUNDAY 4 AUGUST

Prudential RideLondon is the world's greatest festival of cycling with more than 100,000 cyclists participating in seven events on traffic-free roads in London and Surrey. Events will take place in central London on Saturday 3 August and in London and Surrey on Sunday 4 August 2019.

Prudential RideLondon was developed by the Mayor of London, Transport for London and London & Partners in partnership with Surrey County Council and is sponsored by Prudential. The event is managed by the London & Surrey Cycling Partnership.

EVENTS IN SURREY

Sunday 4 August

- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100, a mass participation ride for 25,000 cyclists; passing locally from 07:50 until 13:10.
- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic. Please note: this event will not travel through Coldharbour or Leith Hill in 2019.

All event timings are predicted and may vary slightly.

LOCAL ROAD CLOSURES

Roads closed from 05:00:

A25 from Newlands Corner to Dorking, Abinger Road, Leith Hill Road, Leith Hill Lane, Hollow Lane, Holmbury Road (B2126), Horsham Road (B2126), Felday Road (B2126).

Roads closed from 07:30:

A24 between Dorking and Leatherhead (including Leatherhead Bypass Road), Ockley Road (B2126 / B2127) between Forest Green and Etherley Hill.

Anticipated road reopening times:

Local roads will begin to reopen from 14:00 onwards as soon as it is safe and practical to do so once the mass participation event has passed.

LOCAL INFORMATION

Road reopening in Forest Green, Holmbury St Mary, Abinger Hammer, Gomshall and Shere is anticipated from 14:00. At this time the A25 between Clandon and Abinger Hammer will also reopen. Through traffic travelling eastwards from Guildford along the A25 will be diverted towards the A3 or A248 due to width restrictions on the Horsham Road at Sutton Abinger.

There are no event-related closures on the A29 at any time. The A25 to the east (Redhill) and the A24 to the south (Horsham) of the Cockerel Roundabout in Dorking are open all day.

Dorking train station can be accessed by car throughout the day by using Pixham Lane from the A25 and then approaching the train station car park from the north along the A24.

Please be aware of the wider road closures across the event route in Surrey.

PARKING

Vehicles cannot park on the event route on Sunday 4 August from 00:01. Any vehicle left on the route or parked in a suspended parking bay may be removed.

'No parking' signs will be placed along the edge of the village green to prevent visitor parking.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Emergencies will be treated as a priority in the usual way. If you require the emergency services, call 999. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained and prioritised throughout all of the Prudential RideLondon events. Planning for Prudential RideLondon involves the police, fire and rescue services, ambulance services, local hospitals and other critical welfare services.

ON THE DAY

Stewards and volunteers will be positioned along the route. If you require assistance on the day that is not a 999 emergency, please ask the event staff who will be able to help or escalate issues if necessary. Alternatively, contact our Customer Services team on 0345 894 9773.

COMMUNITY WELFARE

Prudential RideLondon works with a wide variety of care providers across the entire route in order to plan for the impact of closed roads on Sunday 4 August. If you are unsure about care provision on the day or have private arrangements please contact our Customer Services team with further information so we can help you plan appropriately.

ASSISTANCE

SAFETY

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. These will be supervised to help pedestrians cross the road throughout the event. Please note that some existing pedestrian crossings may be suspended, but an alternative, where it is easier to cross, will be clearly signed.

We thank you for your patience during the event. Please listen to instructions given by our stewards and volunteers.

Although roads will be closed to general traffic, there will be bicycles and event vehicles using the road during the closure period. Please do take additional care, looking in both directions when crossing the road or accessing and exiting your property, particularly if there is no footway. In certain locations, stewards will be available to assist you.
