

# LEATHERHEAD

## SUNDAY 4 AUGUST

Prudential RideLondon is the world's greatest festival of cycling with more than 100,000 cyclists participating in seven events on traffic-free roads in London and Surrey. Events will take place in central London on Saturday 3 August and in London and Surrey on Sunday 4 August 2019.

Prudential RideLondon was developed by the Mayor of London, Transport for London and London & Partners in partnership with Surrey County Council and is sponsored by Prudential. The event is managed by the London & Surrey Cycling Partnership.

### EVENTS IN SURREY

Sunday 4 August

- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100, a mass-participation ride for around 25,000 cyclists; passing locally from 08:35 until 15:15.
- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic, a race for 150 professional cyclists; passing through Leatherhead between 17:00 and 17:20.

All event timings are predicted and may vary slightly.

### ROAD CLOSURES

#### Roads closed from 05:00:

A25 from Newlands Corner to Dorking High Street at Moore's Road. Hampton Court Bridge will also close at this time.

#### Roads closed from 07:30:

A24 (Bypass Road) from Beaverbrook Roundabout to Givons Grove Roundabout.  
A24 northbound from Dorking to Burford Bridge.  
A24 southbound from Mickleham to Pixham Roundabout.  
B2450 (Dorking Road), Church Street, The Crescent, Leret Way, Bull Hill and Randalls Road.  
A246 between the junction with the A25 at Clandon and The Street at West Horsley.  
A244 (Oxshott Road/Leatherhead Road) from the junction with Oaklawn Road towards Esher.  
A3 slips at Esher Common.

The A246 between West Horsley and Hawk's Hill/Young Street remains open throughout the day.

#### Oaklawn Road is closed from 08:50:

Oaklawn Road will reopen from 16:15 after the last mass-participation rider has passed to link the A245 to A244 and access the M25. Oaklawn Road will close again for a short period for the race to pass at approximately 17:00.

### Anticipated road reopening times

Roads will begin to reopen from 19:00 as soon as it is safe and practical to do so once the professional race has passed and barriers have been removed from the road.

No roads are closed on Saturday 3 August.

### LOCAL ACCESS

The Swan Shopping Centre and car park will remain open. Access is possible to the car park, vehicles should approach from Bridge Street to North Street where temporary traffic lights will permit entry into and out of the car park. Further car parking is available, see below.

The A246 between West Horsley and Hawk's Hill/Young Street remains open throughout the day.

**Leatherhead Station** – train station drop offs can be made on Station Road when approaching from Guildford Road and Bridge Street or on Kingston Road (A245) on the north of the route. Stewards at pedestrian crossing points will help you cross the event route.

Prior to 14:30 access to and from Mickleham and Givons Grove can be made via Young Street (A246) and a contraflow at the Givons Grove Roundabout throughout the closure period. Givons Grove is accessed via Mickleham Drive and Mickleham is accessed via Old London Road at Box Hill School from the A24. From 14:30 the road is closed for the professional race.

The access arrangements above, and similar ones in other areas, are intended for the convenience of local residents and businesses.

Please be aware of the wider road closures across the event route in Surrey.

### Pedestrian crossing points

Existing crossing points will have stewards present to assist pedestrians to cross the event route.

### CAR PARKING

Free parking is available on Sunday 4 August in the following car parks:

- Swan Shopping Centre car park. Vehicles should approach from Bridge Street to North Street where temporary traffic lights will permit entry into and out of the Swan Centre car park on Leret Way.
- Leatherhead Leisure Centre car park off Guildford Road.

- Lidl car park (1 ½ hours free customer parking) – accessed from Bridge Street into North Street.
- Station Road car park – accessed from Bridge Street into North Street.
- Upper Fairfield Road car park – accessed from Cophorne Road into St John's Avenue.
- Bridge Street car park.
- Leatherhead Trinity School – accessed from Woodlands Road off Kingston Road.

### **LOCAL BUSINESSES / WHAT'S ON**

Shops, cafes and restaurants in Leatherhead will be open. Many locations will be hosting charities, who are supporting riders in the mass participation sportive, and there are many great locations to watch the events.

### **PRUDENTIAL RIDELONDON-SURREY 100**

A rider Hub will be based at the Swan Shopping Centre. With 25 miles to go the cyclists will need support to finish their journey, making it the perfect place to cheer on fundraisers and professionals alike.

The shopping centre is the ideal place to pick up some refreshments from the numerous cafes, coffee shops and restaurants after a long day of cycling or cheering.

### **PRUDENTIAL RIDELONDON-SURREY CLASSIC**

Also on Sunday 4 August, 150 of the world's best professional men, including many Tour de France teams, will race against each other in the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic.

The race starts at Bushy Park in Richmond at 14:10 before travelling through Surrey before returning to London to finish on The Mall. Riders are expected to reach Leatherhead at approximately 17:00 onwards.

### **EMERGENCY SERVICES**

Emergencies will be treated as a priority in the usual way. If you require the emergency services, call 999. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained and prioritised throughout all of the Prudential RideLondon events. Planning for Prudential RideLondon involves the police, fire and rescue services, ambulance services, local hospitals and other critical welfare services.

### **ON THE DAY**

There will be stewards and volunteers positioned along the route. If you require assistance on the day that is not a 999 emergency, please ask the event staff who will be able to help or escalate issues as necessary.

### **COMMUNITY WELFARE**

Prudential RideLondon works with a wide variety of care providers across the entire route in order to plan for the impact of closed roads on Sunday 4 August.

If you are unsure about care provision on the day or have private arrangements, please contact our helpdesk with further information so we can help you to plan appropriately.

### **SAFETY**

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. These will be supervised to help pedestrians cross the road throughout the event. Please note that some existing pedestrian crossings may be suspended, but an alternative, where it is easier to cross, will be clearly signed.

We thank you for your patience during the event. Please listen to instructions given by our stewards and volunteers.

Although roads will be closed to general traffic, there will be bicycles and event vehicles using the road during the closure period. Please do take additional care, looking in both directions when crossing the road or accessing exiting your property, particularly if there is no footway. In certain locations, stewards will be available to assist you.

### **LONDON MARATHON CHARITABLE TRUST**

Prudential RideLondon is part of the London Marathon event family. Organisations in the areas in which London Marathon Events Limited holds events are eligible to apply for grants from The London Marathon Charitable Trust to support facilities that enable increased participation in physical activities.
